

Dear FELMAUSANS:

We, the Executive Committee of FELMAUSA are gratified and delighted to submit this report covering medical activities in the past nine months, in an effort to help, save lives and eradicate the deadly Ebola out of Liberia. Given our *pragmatic* stance we took to reach out to our people, as it was greatly expected based on our track record in delivering medical assistance not only to our Mandingo community but the entire country, Liberia, was again exemplified with lot of commendations and appreciation across the nation. As a result, FELMAUSA is ranked high among other Diaspora philanthropic organizations. The high score was due to the collaboration put in place with our sister organization, The National Mandingo Caucus of Liberia (NMCL) and others.

In August of last year 2014, Our National Convention was held but somehow opposed due the continuous death news of our people pouring on us, minute by minute, hour by hour. But be it as it was, we remained steadfast and went ahead to have the convention ritual as oppose to its cancellation suggested by some. The convention being the only major source of income for FELMAUSA, we chose to have it and dedicated it to eradication of Ebola from Liberia.

After the event, our first point of intervention was: we sent a cash amount of \$5000 to our implementing partner, the NMCL for feeding of quarantined people within our communities that were suspected of having Ebola. And also followed by five infra thermometers requested by our medical experts on the ground, which was used to separate people suspected of high fever or Ebola. Our gratitude to Dr. Swaray and Konneh and others for their services to our community under that constrain circumstances.

Thereafter, FELMAUSA galvanized resources from everywhere possible, mainly through the effort of the medical Mission Team of FELMAUSA, headed by Joe Sackor that secured medications and equipment. Those efforts yielded fruitful results as we got abundance donations. And the same rigorous solicitations by our Medical Mission team lead us a 40foot container shipped to Liberia at no direct cost to FELMAUSA.

The clearing and handling was taken care of by our sister organization, the NMCL. But at that point, FELMAUSA sent \$2960 again upon the request of the Caucus. This amount was used to help other quarantined families with food, and compensated the ambulance crew that sacrificed their lives for our people, the risk takers.

Finally, the medications were sorted out by our medical experts, under the supervision of government agency responsible for Ebola intervention and eradication. The medications and equipment were distributed among 32 healthcare facilities in most parts of Liberia. Some of the counties that received are: Montserrado, Margibi, Bong, Bomi, Nimba, Lofa etc. The ceremony marking the presentation and distribution was attended by high profiled personalities, to include: Sheikh Kafumba Konneh, Hon. Sekou S. Kanneh as well as other government officials. The process was videotaped, which will be sent for your viewer. Also, below is the complete listening of recipients of FELMAUSA Medical relief to Liberia.
